

ATLANTA'S 1st WOMEN OF COLOR INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL March 11 – 12 2005

The 2005 festival had an attendance of over 800 people and was privileged to host Barbara O (Daughters of the Dust, Mangamizi), Dr Yvonne Welbon (Director Sisters in Cinema, the first documentary of its kind to chronicle the history of women of African descent in the Directors chair) and Coquie Hughes (featured in Yvonne Welbons "Sisters in Cinema" and considered to be the first African-American female to direct 3 feature films and the 1st African-American female to ever write, produce and direct a digital feature).
