Welcome to the 6th Annual Women of Color Arts and Film Festival (WOCAF), Atlanta presented in partnership with the Auburn Avenue Research Library on African American Culture and History, a special library of the Atlanta-Fulton Public Library System.

The Women of Color Arts and Film Festival is a multi-discipline event that includes film screenings, a visual art exhibition and a music showcase – all celebrating women of color artists and media makers. The film festival presents films about and by women of color from Africa, America, Asia, the Caribbean, the Middle East and Europe. The art exhibition features the selected works of women throughout the metro Atlanta area, and the performance showcase highlights the musical talents of women of color throughout the global community.

The Auburn Avenue Research Library on African American Culture and History offers specialized reference and archival collections for the study and research of Africana cultures. Through its programming, exhibits and outreach, the Auburn Avenue Research Library hopes to stimulate dialogue, provoke thought, raise questions, celebrate the similarities and differences among people, and to encourage scholarly research. With Reference and Research, Archives, and Program Divisions, the Library provides a wide range of free educational services and programs of special interests to the public.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Visual artists are invited to participate in the WOCAF Festival. We seek and encourage submissions from local and regional, new and emerging artists to exhibit their artwork at the Festival. Each artist, in addition to exhibiting, is also expected to participate in a formal outreach activity during the Festival. This activity is a key component for the community aspect of the festival and includes participation as a panel member in a Humanities Forum in conjunction with the exhibition. This opportunity not only offers artists a venue to showcase their artwork, but also provide assistance in their personal growth and professional development in a creative setting.
